12 Christ is just like the human body—a body is a unit and has many parts; and all the parts of the body are one body, even though there are many. 13 We were all baptized by one Spirit into one body, whether Jew or Greek, or slave or free, and we all were given one Spirit to drink. 14 Certainly the body isn't one part but many. (1 Corinthians 12:12-14 CEB)

I grew up in a very small midwestern town where everyone was white, protestant, and middle class. Anyone who was "different" stood out, and they often were avoided. While I'm not sure we realized how cautious we were around people who had a different skin color, who were differently abled, or who were "different" in any way, it certainly happened. As an adult, I learned how ingrained prejudice is in our world, and I have taken many workshops and courses to help me raise my own awareness, as well as the awareness of others in dealing with racism (sexism, homophobia, ageism, and many other "ism's").

What I have grown to realize is that our work is never done, and we need to continue to grow in understanding as we embrace others. It wasn't until I began to have friends of other races, ethnic backgrounds, and sexual orientations that I realized what a beautiful world we live in with all the diversity and the gifts that we can receive from and share with each other.

We are reminded in Paul's letter to the church in Corinth that we have many members world-wide, and in spite of - or maybe even because of - our diversity, we are one body in Christ. It is in Christ Jesus that we find our common ground and are drawn together as brothers and sisters no matter where and how we live together, what our ethnic background is, or what color our skin might be.








SOCIAL MEDIA










HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY


MOTHER'S DAY


