In a neighborhood that was always full of trash, the Pastor just got up every morning and started sweeping the streets with the broom. And the Pastor began to bring pretty flowerpots one by one on the road. People wondered how these things could possibly change this area. The Pastor's work seemed to have nothing to do with the various problems of the street. However, the Pastor did not give up and brought tiny flower pots to the front of the house one by one and watered them.

But something amazing happened. Flowers began to bloom, and the scent of flowers began to bloom on the deserted and gloomy streets. Then people started to come to the scary road where no one came. And people who had stayed at home because they were afraid of the street started to come out one by one. As the streets became more crowded, the drug trade that had taken place in the street began to disappear. And there was less and less violence. Then children's dreams began to grow here.

The deserted street became a place where volunteers from all over the country came in summer to hold a camp for local children together. The children opened their eyes to the world outside the street. Children may not have the opportunity to go outside of town, but the world has come to them. The darkness that never seemed to go away was lifted by the small obedience of one man who had hope in the Lord.

So is our calling. We see a lot of problems we can't seem to solve. But today, we rejoice in the Lord's perfect love for us and plant small light. The tiny seeds of faith planted in gratitude for the grace of the Lord who loved us will never disappear. What flower will we plant today in our lives and our neighborhood? The "frozen" pie option has done incredibly well and we will be looking to increase the availability BUT....can only make that happen with the help of some new PIE ANGELS!






