Gather Food Pantry called and asked if their Mobile Van could use our parking lot every other Monday from 2 - 3 pm for food distribution to the neighboring housing buildings. This item is on the Leadership Board's agenda and will be discussed and voted on.

Planet Rangers and AA have asked about our Giving Tree/Share the Joy program. As the calendar doesn't allow enough time for placing 'wish list' gifts on the tree, a creative Star idea from Bevan will be set up. Share the Joy stars will be on the tree for donations to Share the Joy or donations to the new Sunday School/community music program.

Marion Collishaw's daughter called with an update on her health. Marion is in full dementia now and began living in a nursing home at the beginning of this year. She is in poor health and needs to be fed. She turns 99 next week. Her daughter will continue to update FUMC on her condition.

## 2022 Pumpkin Patch Report

This year's Pumpkin Patch generated \$47,557.25 in sales, our second-highest amount in our 18 years! Our 40% profit was an amazing \$19,022.90!

Our first truck unloading on Sat., 9/24 went well. To provide the greatest safety, I planned for the truck to be emptied from 9-10:30 a.m. by a handful of volunteers, including the Bobcat driver. Then at 10:30 a.m., the bulk of volunteers arrived and emptied all of the pumpkin and gourd bins onto pallets in just 45 minutes! Having our pumpkins bin-loaded and renting a Bobcat with forklift with an experienced volunteer driver is definitely the way to go. We sold out of small gourds and pumpkins the week before our second truck arrived on Sat.,10/15. The second unloading went quickly, too.

The Patch was open Monday-Friday from 12:30-6:30 p.m. and on weekends and Columbus Day from 10:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m. Since there were not many morning customers on Columbus Day, starting next year we will open at 12:30 p.m. Our Booth volunteers were from our congregation, AA friends, a few Planet Rangers parents and camper teams, and a HUGE number of Portsmouth High School students in National Honor Society, Interact Club, and the Service Learning Class! Again, most of my time was spent getting to know and training new community volunteers.

Our Pie Team welcomed a few new volunteers to bake on Tuesday and Friday mornings from about 9 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. We worked really well together and had lots of fun, too. Our customers also enjoyed buying other yummy baked goodies and fudge made by some church folks.

North Hill Nursery again partnered with us to provide gorgeous mums as we needed them.

Food and Mums brought in \$5,749.40, less expenses. (Look for the final profit in the December Beacon.) Due to the increased cost of ingredients, prices may have to be increased for next year.

Our customers and volunteers loved our Gratitude Pumpkin so much that we needed 5 of them!

After-school Planet Rangers helped move pumpkins to fill empty spaces on the front pallets on several days. The Portsmouth High School Service Learning Class again had a field trip and helped do a lot of Patch maintenance (AKA moving pumpkins from back pallets to front ones and removing rotten ones). All 4 of the Little Harbor 1st grade classes walked to the Patch to choose a Spookie and receive stickers. The Portsmouth Middle School Special Education Class loved coming over to learn how to work in the Booth and even brought their own customers!

The Giving Tree received \$1,111.43 in donations which will again be used to purchase Christmas gifts for local foster children.


A neighbor, who has donated Halloween candy for years, came over regularly this year to visit and hand out stickers and candy, as well as welcome and thank customers.

There were 228 pies lovingly made and sold at the Pumpkin Patch and 78 were made for Thanksgiving...that's 306 pies!!!


