MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JACKIE



"Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Ephesians 4:31-32

Dear Friends,

As I write this note, I find myself deep in grief over the sudden passing of Bishop Suda Devadhar. Bishop Devadhar appointed me as a District Superintendent 7 years ago and his untimely death is such a loss to me and all those who loved him. He was a great man of God; deeply committed to God and our United Methodist church. One of Bishop Devadhar's gifts was his willingness to ask for forgiveness. It was not uncommon for him to end a meeting asking forgiveness if he had offended anyone in anyway. I admired that about him. His humility was disarming.

I don't know about you but in my life, I have experienced hurt from other people at times. Sadly, I'm sure I have hurt others as well. Bishop Devadhar's sudden death reminds me that our days on Earth are not guaranteed. None of us knows what is around the corner for ourselves or our loved ones. As I ponder this truth, I find that I want to enjoy my time and not waste any of it on holding grudges or anger. I would rather let it go and make the most of whatever time I have been given. How about you?

Would you join me in forgiving those who have hurt you and asking for forgiveness where you may have offended? It is not an easy exercise. I know that there are some hurts that are so deep that they are not easy to let go of. We can only do this work through the power of the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness does not mean allowing someone to continue to abuse you nor does it mean forgetting horrific treatment from another but it does mean allowing God to carry it instead of ourselves. I know that letting go, helps our mental and physical health. From personal experience, it is so freeing to give these burdens to God.

Let me start by asking your forgiveness for any offense I may have caused you. I extend forgiveness for any offenses you may have caused me as well. If you are carrying anger and bitterness around, I encourage you to let it go. You will be healthier and so will our church. Let's learn from Bishop Suda today and be the saints God made us to be.
