

FINANCIAL SUMMARY [John VanReenen]

A special Financial Task Force was created via the recommendation from the Special Church Conference meeting conducted at the church on July 8. The Task Force's charter is to evaluate our current financial shortfall, brainstorm ideas to bring the church's income (closer) to it's expenses, thus creating a balanced budget, seek help from outside the congregation where possible, and report back with its findings to the congregation no later than October 31 of this year. The FUMC Nominating Committee met to form the Task Force, which now consists of the following FUMC members; Kellie Langs, Christine Williams, David Richards, Steve Scott, Nancy Chesser, Linda Reiber, Jen Berry and John VanReenen.

It was suggested that the Task Force seek help from the United Methodist Foundation, who provides financial consulting to all Methodist churches in New England, with special attention for those in financial trouble or those who wish to either repurpose their facilities or augment their income through better use of those facilities. The United Methodist Foundation also holds and manages the FUMC invested funds. The TF reached out to Rev. Herb Taylor to obtain the Foundation's assistance in the form of financial consulting for our church. It should be noted that the fee of \$750 for this assistance was covered by two generous FUMC families.


The initial meeting with Herb, assisted by UMF president Ted Crass, was conducted at the church on August 9. Herb and Ted were given a complete tour of our facilities, with special attention given to the improvements and upgrades that have been made over the past several years. The meeting itself was conducted with the Financial Task Force, Pastor Jackie, Sue Richards, Sue Sarosiek and Sue Lange. Following a brief review of the Foundation and its functions and services, how the consulting process will unfold and general introductory comments the following topics were reviewed in detail:



- Core Values of First UMC's Ministry; What is Your Identity; the Why
- The Community Which First UMC Serves; the Contextual Reality
- Who Would be Important to Talk to Outside Church Family to Provide Insight?
- SWOT for the First UMC Building Site; How Does Your Primary Asset Help?
- Final Thoughts
- Next Steps and Closing Prayer

Herb and Ted seemed pleased with the content and results from the meeting and with the involvement from the Task Force and left the group with a homework assignment to be completed by the next meeting, which is scheduled for Monday, September 11 @ 6:30pm.






FACILITIES REPORT [Sue Sarosiek]


SRS Masonry has completed repairing areas in the sanctuary that had a leak issue during last winter as well as finished the painting near back door replacement.

During a rainstorm at the beginning of July, a leak occurred in the IBG office. After investigation, ServPro, and insurance adjusters, the leak was due to the outside spigot pipe leaking on the inside. J. Golter Plumbing is making this repair. Claim was made and insurance will cover this claim.

Ongoing discussion with J. Golter Plumbing and Heating, Unitil Gas, and City Gas inspectors to increase the size of gas pipe coming into FUMC, as the pipe isn't large enough which creates a low pressure problem when boiler is running. This is costing Unitil approximately \$10,000 to complete and they are making sure all their i's are dotted and t's are crossed.

Recovery Church is launched on 8/30.

Planet Rangers has one more week of summer camp. Several walls have markings/scuffs that will be removed by Planet Rangers at end of camp.

SPRC REPORT [Sue Richards]

The Communications and Marketing Director position was extended through 10/31/23, at the SPRC-recommended salary of \$25,000 with fewer tasks. The recently created Financial Task Force will include a recommendation about this position in the plan they present to the congregation by the end of October.






PRAYERS, CARDS, CALLS OR VISITS
