Dear Friends, If I am reading the signs in the heavens correctly, we have jumped into Fall and started a crazy busy season in the life of our church. No, we may not know the events we will experience, but we can know how we will approach them. We can determine to live each moment with love toward God and our fellow creatures. We can ask ourselves each day, where we have found God and how God might be directing us. Are we acting with love toward ourselves and others in each decision we make? Are we allowing fear, anger or ego to drive our choices rather than love? Have we stopped the merry go round of life long enough to even contemplate and pray over such concerns?





PASTOR'S REPORT [Pastor Jackie]

Goals:

- 1. Meet with as many people as possible to hear their stories, learn about their spiritual needs and begin to form a pastoral/congregational bond.
- 2. Form a one-year worship plan that incorporates the lectionary readings, pastoral vision, and congregational needs. The focus for the year will be on discipleship.
- 3. Meet with the various Boards and committees and engage in mutual sharing and goal setting.
- 4, In partnership with the congregation, address the financial and organizational needs of the congregation.
- 5, Encourage love and forgiveness, rather than divisiveness, as we strive to improve the spiritual bond between parishioners and church leaders.

Current Status:

I will be asking committees to prepare their reports so that we can get them finished before our conference season. All reports are to be submitted online this year. I will be talking to the various chairs to make sure that happens.

The Financial Task Force will be getting ready to make its recommendations to the church in the next 30 days. We have met three times and have one future meeting scheduled.

Pumpkin palooza is well on its way with many volunteers making it happen!


Concerns:

Communication: It is very difficult to function effectively without attention to our communication. It needs to be frequent and repetitive. Yes, this takes more work but is going to save us in the long run. The more we work at communication, the easier it will be when we need to discuss sensitive matters

Leadership: Our leadership team is so small that often we cannot do what we need to do because there is a lack of time for so few to do so much. I am recommending us to widen our leadership team to address this concern.

FACILITIES REPORT [Sue Sarosiek]


Unitil plans the dig to upgrade our gas flow into building into a larger pipe. A larger pipe had to be installed inside the building as well to meet the larger pipe being installed outside. This may have been the reason the previous heating company had issues with the gas flow. Jim Golter has been instrumental in follow up with Unitil. Unitil will complete the digging in the parking lot by the end of October. Unfortunately, we may have to close the Pumpkin Patch for a day while this work is being completed. To date, over \$5000.00 has been received in donations for the boiler project.

John VanReenen fixed the toilet in the upstairs bathroom. The toilet handle had broken on the inside of tank. Thank you John!

There is a large wasp nest outside on one of the stained glass windows. They have been sprayed and Liam has asked for the empty nest. John sprayed the nest. Again, thank you John!

As has been previously reported, the parsonage has been without hot water on several occasions, due to the furnace not working properly. Jim Golter has serviced it many times and reports there is much corrosion in furnace. The recommendation is that no further service to the current furnace be done. The furnace is at the end of its life span and needed to be replaced.




CARING FOR EACH OTHER

WINTER IS COMING!


Helping the community stay warm.


