
This week, I am thankful for each of you, faithful servants of the Lord. I thank you for your generosity of spirit as we ramp up our

#### PASTOR'S REPORT [Pastor Jackie]

#### Goals:

- 1. Prepare for the church conference on November 13, 2023.
- 2. Work with the Financial Task Force to finalize recommendations.
- 3. Help committees formulate their 2024 goals.
- 4. Help congregation grow in its spiritual discipleship.

#### **Current Status:**

The church is poised to make important financial decisions. This is not an easy task. No matter which way the church chooses to handle its fiscal responsibilities, sacrifices will need to be made. I have tried to use the sermons series Welcome To The Table, to emphasize how disciples of Christ live together in fellowship even when differences are apparent. I pray that our leadership board will model for the congregation this spirit of love and compromise. As church leaders we need to empower everyone to feel comfortable sharing their perspectives and be the voices of reason and reconciliation if folks are concerned with the results of decisions made. It will be up to us to model how we respect other's perspectives even when they differ from our own.

#### Celebrations:

Sunday School has begun. All of our teaching staff have had their background checks updated. Students have releases signed to use photos in church publications.

The pool of volunteers both within the congregation and in outside groups has increased. The volunteers who share their musical or dramatic talent have been more active making our worship very joyful!

Worship attendance is increasing. The congregation is handling the Covid realities very well. Safe practices have allowed the church to continue with no drop off in attendance.

#### Concerns:

I have been told by parishioners that there have been times in the past when the congregation has been divided when certain choices have been made, leaving scars and tension. I think it will be important for us to set the tone for the church as it grapples with the issues of finances so that it will not divide the congregation but bring us closer together.



#### FINANCIAL REPORT [John VanReenen]

The Financial Task Force has met twice with our consultants from the United Methodist Foundation. Our third and final meeting will be on October 23 at the church at 6:30pm. At that time we expect to receive the Foundation's recommendations for addressing and resolving the church's financial shortfall.

The Task Force will then convene a planning meeting on Sunday, November 29, at the church immediately following worship. We will review the Foundation's recommendations and assemble them into a plan for future implementation. They will be reviewed and put into order of priority and feasibility of completion for sharing with the congregation. Then on Sunday, November 5, also immediately following worship, the FTF will present their final recommendations to the congregation during this all-church gathering.

The importance of this meeting to the future of First UMC Portsmouth cannot be overstated. We are hoping for a significant turnout and want to make sure the congregation knows that all are invited and have a voice.

Linda reports that our pledge giving is on the rise and trying to catch up to last year's levels. Our property and liability insurance has risen sharply this year to over \$2,100 per month. Linda saves almost \$100 per month via automatic payments.

#### FINANCIAL REPORT CONTINUED

Our church boiler installation is complete and has been paid in full with invested funds. The congregation contributions against the \$40,000+ replacement cost have reached \$6,610. We are in the process of evaluating running both boilers on gas, which could save us significant money if implemented. There is an up-front cost of \$8,000 to switch the old boiler over from oil to gas. Just an FYI, our gas bill last year was \$4,198 (sanctuary only) vs. \$21,805 for oil (balance of church space).


#### FACILITIES REPORT [Sue Sarosiek]

A big thank you to David Richards for clearing the men's urinal downstairs. It appears to be fully functioning at this time.

Our food service permit license has been applied for and received from the City of Portsmouth. The grease trap permit has been applied for and received as well. The city inspectors were present at the pumping of the grease trap by Hussey Septic on October 5, to determine if we are still eligible for the every 6 month pumping. Typically, grease traps are pumped every month. FUMC was granted a waiver to continue bi-yearly grease trap cleaning. The reason grease traps are inspected yearly, beginning 2023, is due to the new wastewater pumping station at Pierce Island. The amount of wastewater treated is so high that it now falls under FDA rules; FDA rules state grease traps need to be inspected yearly.

Unitil rescheduled the digging of the larger gas line to 10/17. A quote of approximately \$8000.00 has been given to convert our current oil burner to a gas burner. John VanReenen will present the proposed cost savings at the Leadership Board on 10/17. Due to Unitil construction, pie baking did not happen on 10/17.

The parsonage furnace has been replaced and functioning.

Planet Rangers has completed summer camp. Planet Rangers staff have cleaned and removed markings/scuffs on several walls.

The AA nooner group is very happy to be back at FUMC and cleaned the carpet downstairs the morning of 9/30.



The yard sale was a success! The final tally on the yard sale profit is: \$1226.50. A special thank you to our community friends for all the help.

Pumpkin Patch unloading was on Saturday, 9/23. So many helpers from the community were present to help unload pumpkins.


Helping the community stay warm.


