
















SHARE THE JOY




CHILDREN'S PAGEANT CHRISTMAS EVE DAY






CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE




CARING FOR EACH OTHER

We also lift up in prayer those names that have been shared with us a community as they go through their own challenges and we ask that God cradles them in His loving arms.










Dear Church Family,

PASTOR'S REPORT REV. DR. JACKIE BRANNEN - 12/19/23

As you know, United Methodists are connectional in nature and one of the ways we are connected is through our governance. Each church belongs to a district and a Conference, a jurisdiction and then the denomination. The leader of the Conference is the Bishop assigned to that area. District Superintendents and Bishops supervise pastors and make sure that churches are following the guidelines given to us from the Book Of Discipline. This collaborative structure allows us to move together toward the goals that are set for us as a denomination. In much the same way as our US government structure, the Denomination is made up of both laity and clergy and these representatives determine what the goals of the denomination are. Each church is represented at the Conference level as well. With all that in mind, the District Superintend and Bishop give goals to pastors and SPRC/church leadership at the beginning of new appointments.

The following missional challenges were given to me/us when I became your pastor.


- 1. Work with the Transition Team to make the change of pastoral leadership as smooth as possible. Meet all members within the first 12 months in small groups or individually in their homes.
- 2. Work with consultant Betsy Waters and First UMC's Outreach and Organizational Development Task Force to develop a strategic plan for the church.
- 3. Help the congregation to make the spiritual growth of members and development of accountable discipleship a priority.
- 4. Oversee administrative matters and ensure that church structure, procedures, and governance are in compliance with the Book of Discipline and in the best interest of the congregation.
- 5. Guide the congregation to adopt a sustainable level of spending. Help the church develop a strong stewardship program to support a balanced budget and to pay 100% of Mission Shares.
- 6. Challenge and inspire the congregation for the ministry of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in Portsmouth, the United States, and around the world, through preaching, teaching, and worship.

We are now almost at the 6 month mark of this appointment. I have not worked with a transitional team as of yet since none was organized by the SPRC. I have done some of the work of that team on my own and other tasks like visitation are yet to be accomplished. We are just now starting the discussion around working with Betsy Waters. I hope to be able to start this goal in earnest in 2024.

I have attempted to encourage the congregation's spiritual growth through worship, mid-week reflections and have offered a Bible study for adults and confirmation classes for youth. To date, there have only been a few who have stated they are interested in the Bible study. It may be that the timing for a Confirmation class is not going to be this winter. While the congregation is very motivated in service, there is more of a hesitation in spiritual growth. I will continue to offer opportunities. I have spent the bulk of my time in administration and financial accountability. There is movement in both of these areas with much more to do but the pieces are in place to continue in this work. The church is very motivated to be good neighbors to the community of Portsmouth. The area of growth still needed is to help the church connect these ministries to our purpose; to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

This month has been very busy. While some tasks such as the work of the Financial Task Force have been behind the scenes, preparing for Christmas and concentrating on our children and youth have taken center stage. Our Sunday School program is still not quite where we want it to be. We need more adults to step into this area so that we can accomplish what we envision for our children. While almost everyone agrees that children are the future of the church, it is difficult to get volunteers in this area. We will continue to encourage folks to set this as personal priority.

There are still many in the congregation who have gifts to be used and perhaps would step into new roles if asked. It had been wonderful to see so much energy and volunteering around the worship service. The recent potluck was an amazing witness to the fact that our congregation is hungry for fellowship, and good cooking! Let's do more of that!



FACILITIES REPORT - SUE SAROSIEK - 12/19/23

As noted in the community report, Jim Golter, our heating wizard, has completed the installation of the new boiler and conversion of our oil burner to gas. He was instrumental in receiving approval from the City of Portsmouth and Unitil, and oversaw the completion of the install of a larger gas pipe to meet the heating needs of the church building.

As the oil tanks were full of oil at boiler oil to gas conversion time, a quote was received to remove the oil for \$1400. Sam Bovee also gave an estimate of removing the oil and tanks (100 gals at a time) in exchange for the oil itself.

The City of Portsmouth Health Department conducted a surprise kitchen inspection. The kitchen passed with a grade of 94. The noted concerns have been corrected and noted in Inspector's return visit.

COMMUNITY REPORT - SUE SAROSIEK - 12/19/23

The Share the Joy tree is up and several of FUMC's community partners have taken stars from the tree to fill Christmas wishes of children in need. Also, new this year, the Center for Wellbeing has also partnered with FUMC to provide gifts. A total of 49 children and families have been helped this Christmas. The wrapping angels included congregation members, previous church members, AA folks, and community folks. Thank you all for your help!!

Jim Golter, our plumber, stopped into the office to check in. He checked in at church every single day, for two weeks, since installing our boilers to check on their functioning. He noticed and commented on all the good FUMC does in the community. He observed FUMC's commitment to the community Every Single Day!
