

Our church sanctuary will be open for quiet meditation and reflection on Good Friday -March 29th from 12-3pm
















#### Isabella's Birthday Cupcakes

- 11/2 cups of flour.
- · 2 cups of sugar
- 3/4 cup of cocos powder
- 2 tsp baking powder
- Vz tsp beking sode
- 1/2 tsp salt
- Stick of butter (or a half cup)
- 1 cup of milk
- 1 cup (8 az) of brewed coffee (stronger is BETTER!)

• 2.eggs

- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- Cupcake liners

Preheat over to 325 degrees. Sift together flour, baking powder, baking soda and sait. Set aside.

Melt butter in a big saucepan over medium heat. Once it is melted, stir in the coops powder until fragrant then take the pan off of the heat.

Next, mix the coffee and milk into the pan. Then whisk in the sugar first, followed by the eggs and vanilla, mixing together until the sugar has dissolved.

Finally, add the flour mixture to the rest of the batter and stir it all together with a spatula until combined. If your batter is lumpy, you can switch to a whisk once all the flour is incorporated. However, be careful not to gyarmix; a few small lumps are okay.

To finish, pour the batter evenly into lined mulfin tins. Fill them up almost to the top, about three-querters of the way full. Bake approximately 12-5 minutes.

- . 3/4 cup of butter
- We cap of shortening
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- 1/2 cups Nestle Coffee mate Espresse Chacolate liquid coffee creamer (alternatively, make your own by using one this por instant espresse powder and 1/2 cup of milk or cream, whatever you have

Cream together the butter and shortening, scraping the bowl once with a spatula and mixing again. You can also amit the shortening and replace it with the same amount of butter.

With the mixer on medium speed, add the powdered sugar one cup at a time. Scrape the bowl in between each mix to remove any sugar sticking to the sides. After the last cup, the mixture will be slightly crumbly.

Start by adding just one-quarter cup of the liquid (whether coffee creamer or homemade espresso mixture), mixing to test the consistency. It should come together smoothly, but if the frosting is too runny add more sugar.


















#### MEET PASTOR ROBERT [BOB] STEWART



We had our first VBS last year and we had 7-8 children in attendance.

I look forward to being in ministry with First United Methodist Church - Portsmouth. One thing that I have always emphasized in my career over the years, including ministry, is that there is no "I" in the word "TEAM." It will take a team to build and grow the church. 


#### FROM KAYA SAROSIEK - "Super Hero Mom"

### FROM PENNYSUE ORR - "Be the things you loved most about the people who are gone"








#### CARING FOR EACH OTHER


