Sacrifices are going to be needed to fix the financial crisis that you continue to face. There will need to be bold action on your part as you live into what God is calling you to. Do not fear! The things you hold on to in an effort to keep you feeling safe and secure are actually holding you back. God has a better way and you can only see it once you let God's way be your way.

I hope and pray that my tenure among you has been a time for you to get ready to move forward. We have certainly begun to honestly face the issues that are in front of us and to begin to talk about what is really important. Your decision to host Recovery Church has been a strong witness to what Christ is doing in the community. It has been one of my great joys to see this ministry blossom and to see some of those members feel welcome to join us on Sunday morning. It has also been a blessing to see our numbers in worship grow. Of course, the children in our fellowship remain one of our best opportunities to share the gospel. These young people are the most important part of our legacy. I pray you will continue to grow in your love and dedication to them. They are our future.

I will certainly miss you all and will be praying from the sidelines as I check in with you as your District Superintendent. Our goodbye is more of a see you later! I know that I leave you in good hands and that Bob, like myself, will feel privileged to serve our God with you. Together we are all the body of Christ. Be bold my friends as you love like Christ loves us all.





HER STORY IS ONE OF LOVE AND SUPPORT FOR FIRST UMC




CARING FOR EACH OTHER


We also lift up in prayer those names that have been shared with us as they go through their own challenges and we ask that God cradles them in His loving arms.












SAYING forewell to pastor Jackie
