FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR BOB...

I sit in the quietness of my office at home on this Thanksgiving morning. I want to wish all of you a Happy Thanksgiving holiday and it is my hope that you had the opportunity to celebrate Thanksgiving with family and friends. If we separate thanksgiving into two words... "thanks" and "giving"... I think we can sense the nature of the season. The nature of the season is giving thanks. Let us not let the busyness of our lives cause us to lose what is truly important in our lives. Please stop and take a moment from all the busyness of life to pause and reflect on giving thanks to God for all your many blessings. Thank you God! What do you want to thank God for at this very moment?

This coming Sunday, December 1st we begin a new season in the life of the church...Advent. In my Student Bible Dictionary, Advent is translated from a Latin word for "coming." Advent usually refers to Christ's coming to earth as a baby, but now more broadly it is the season of preparation to celebrate Christmas. Jesus' coming to earth began the Christ story as we know it, including His birthday, his life and ministry, ascent to heaven, and the promised second coming...or what is called the "second advent." Each year we are reminded and relive the first advent which is the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul writes in Philippians 2 beginning at verse 5 You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had. 6 Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to.
7 Instead, he gave up his divine privileges; he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, 8 he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross. 9 Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest honor and gave him the name above all other names, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

So I am "giving thanks" to God for the gift he sent to us so many years ago. I want the birth of Jesus to be fresh each and every year for me and you. I want us to celebrate being born again. I am giving thanks to God for sending us a Savior. Jesus is the Reason for the Season, and it is my prayer that this Advent and Christmas season you feel God's **Hope**, God's **Peace**, God's **Joy** and God's **Love**. I know you will feel the power of the season if you pause and turn your eyes upon Jesus.

See you all in church, Come Let Us Adore Him!

PUMPKIN PATCH 2024

A huge thank you to all the volunteers — both regular and new — who helped make this year's Pumpkin Patch a success. Your time and effort were truly appreciated!

Patch Set-Up and Pumpkin Unloading

Set-up started with 7 volunteers moving pallets, putting up signs, and shifting hay bales. Then, on September 28th, 53 volunteers made quick work of unloading pumpkins. On October 19th, 41 volunteers signed in, but many more showed up, making it our fastest second unloading ever!

The Booth

This year, several volunteers helped out, with some doing 1-3 shifts per week. We had 11 new weekday volunteers, including 10 Portsmouth High School students, and 23 new weekend volunteers — 8 adults and 15 students from local schools.

A special thanks to 12 Italian exchange students who came on October 16th, along with their chaperones, to help move pumpkins for our second truckload.

Little Harbor Elementary School

We also had a visit from 2nd graders at Little Harbor Elementary. They took a field trip to the patch, picking out Spookies funded by the school's donations.

Pie Team and Baking

Our Pie Team baked 22 to 41 pies each Tuesday and Friday, with 5 to 9 volunteers and 3 "guest bakers." We sold 233 pies this year! Thanks to Gather's generous donation of 120 lbs. of flour and 3 boxes of apples, we had plenty of ingredients to bake with.

Mums and Treats

We sold 153 mums, including 4 ·", 6", and 8" pots, as well as special Texas Baskets. North Hill Nursery sold them to us at a discount, or at cost for those they grew just for us. We also sold 251 bags of homemade treats, thanks to our bakers and fudge makers.

Support for Kids First

We raised \$1,161.90 for Kids First, which provides Christmas gifts to foster kids and their caregivers. It's always heartwarming to support such a worthy cause.

Pumpkin and Gourd Sales

We sold \$50,989.75 in pumpkins and gourds and \$6,409.00 in food and other items, for a total of \$57,398.75 in sales. With profits of \$20,395.90 from pumpkins and \$5,185.55 from everything else, we raised a grand total of \$25,581.45 — our second-highest total in 21 years!

Final Steps

On November 1st, we sent the remaining pumpkins and gourds to four local farms to feed their animals. The farmers also helped clean up by stacking pallets and emptying the trailer. On November 3rd, we held a Thank You Luncheon, and 11 volunteers helped put everything away for next year.

Thank you again to everyone who helped make this year's Pumpkin Patch a huge success!
