FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR BOB...

The psalmist writes in Psalm 51; "Have mercy on me, O God, because of your unfailing love. Because of your great compassion, blot out the stain of my sins. ² Wash me clean from my guilt. Purify me from my sin. ³ For I recognize my rebellion; it haunts me day and night. ⁴ Against you, and you alone, have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your sight. You will be proved right in what you say, and your judgment against me is just. ¹⁰ Create in me a clean heart, O God; put a new, faithful spirit deep inside me!"

On Wednesday, March 5, 2025, we enter into the season of Lent. For those who do participate, Lent is typically a time of personal reflection, prayer, and spiritual renewal rather than strict fasting or obligatory practices. The intent of a Lenten observance is to recognize our need for repentance and to recognize that we have perhaps grown apart from God. Lent is our opportunity to return and draw closer to God, and to prepare our hearts for the celebration of Easter."

This year as a congregation I am asking us, together, to use "The Sanctuary for Lent 2025" written by Justin LaRosa. The Sanctuary for Lent 2025 contains a reading for each day of Lent, from Ash Wednesday (March 5th) through Easter Sunday (April 20th), including a suggested Scripture, a short devotion, and a brief prayer – all based on the Revised Common Lectionary. Through his thoughtful meditations on the Bible, Justin LaRosa helps you to open yourself daily to God as you journey through the season of Lent.

How long is Lent? Lent is the 40-day period leading up to Easter, (excluding Sundays) that starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. Why is Lent 40 days? The 40-day period of Lent is symbolic of significant biblical events, including:

Jesus' 40 days of fasting and temptation in the wilderness. Moses spending 40 days on Mount Sinai receiving the Ten Commandments. Elijah's 40-day journey to Mount Horeb. The 40 days of rain during the Great Flood. The Israelites' 40 years of wandering in the desert.

Psalm 51 that I shared above is a traditional Scripture used for Ash Wednesday and for the start of the Lenten season. It is a call for us to pause and reflect on our lives and our relationship with God; a time of repentance; a time for fasting; and a time of prayer. Psalm 51 is the first writing and devotion in your booklet "The Sanctuary for Lent 2025." Over the years many of us have developed a practice of giving up or "FAST" from something so we can "FEAST" on that which would help draw us closer to God. I found this prayer a few years back titled *The Fast Life*...the author is unknown. This prayer made a huge impact on me, so much so that I pray this Fast Life Prayer each and every day of Lent. The prayer is included at the end of my writing. I will have copies available so that perhaps you too might use this prayer each day in conjunction with using The Sanctuary for Lent 2025 devotional.

As we journey through Lent, my desire and wish for each of us is that we will experience a transformation in our lives to draw us closer to God...draw us closer to Jesus! I hope you find a deep and meaningful Lenten season this year and above all...I WISH YOU JESUS!


So, when you see Marilyn with her clipboard, consider saying, "Here I am!"
