





## FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR BOB...

From hymn #504 in the United Methodist hymnal we hear and sing these words...On a hill far away stood an old rugged cross, the emblem of suffering and shame; and I love that old cross where the dearest and best for a world of lost sinners was slain. As I write to you this morning we are on day 23 of our 40-day journey toward that Old Rugged Cross. I hope your Lenten journey has been meaningful for you each personally. Each of our journeys should include repentance, prayer, personal reflection and scripture as we seek to strengthen our relationship with Jesus.

On April 13<sup>th</sup> we enter the final stretch or as I have been talking with the children...the final leg (EGG) of our journey toward that Old Rugged Cross. We enter Holy Week on Sunday, April 13, 2025 with Palm Sunday and Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We will share the Passion Story on Palm Sunday and hear all the various events that will take place in what we call Holy Week. If you would like to participate with me in telling and sharing the Passion Story on Palm Sunday, please speak to me directly or send me an email that you are interested in participating.

When I reflect on everything that happened in one short week over two-thousand plus years ago, I am so grateful for the sacrifice that Jesus made for me and you. On Maundy Thursday, April 17<sup>th</sup> we will gather in the sanctuary for a Tenebrae Service which will include a dramatic dialogue between Judas and Simon Peter in the Upper Room during the Passover. The service will include Holy Communion served by the two disciples as it was on this night that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples. The service will begin at 6:30pm so please invite your family and friends to experience this part of the Lenten journey.

I have had the opportunity and privilege to gather with 17 other disciples of Jesus Christ as we explored the Final Words From the Cross by Adam Hamilton. It has been a remarkable experience for me and for those that were faithful to this study. We can all experience these Final Words of Jesus together at 2:00pm in the sanctuary on Good Friday, April 18<sup>th</sup>.

And then we celebrate Easter as He Is Risen...He Is Risen Indeed! I hope you come with your family and friends on Easter Sunday as I offer the message "TA-DA!"

For now my friends...I'll cherish the old rugged cross, till my trophies at last I lay down; I will cling to the old rugged cross and exchange it some day for a crown. That crown is our prize...

RESURRECTION!

Grace and peace...See you in church!

Dear Church Family,

As we reflect on the financial activities of February, I wanted to share an update on our church's finances. While our expenses exceeded our revenue by only about \$200, this gap was primarily due to an increase in utilities, which saw a rise of approximately \$1,000 for the month.

However, I am thrilled to report that, thanks to the generosity of two special donors—one who gave anonymously and another in memory of a loved one—we were able to pay off the line of credit secured by the parsonage house. This line of credit was originally opened to cover masonry repairs that, as many of you know, became a larger project than anticipated. These donations have helped us erase that debt, and I want to express my deepest gratitude to those who contributed. It's truly heartwarming to see how our church is filled with everyday angels, always looking out for each other and our shared mission.

"But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you." (Matthew 6:3-4, NIV)

Looking ahead, I believe that a key focus for us should be fundraising efforts to help raise revenue for future capital improvements, rather than relying on credit lines or using our invested funds. With careful planning and dedication, we can build a sustainable foundation for the church's future.

I'd also like to invite anyone who is interested in learning more about our church's finances to attend our upcoming finance meeting. These meetings are open to all members of the congregation, and I encourage you to come and get involved. The next meeting will take place on **Friday, April 11th at 6:30 PM**, and a Zoom link can be provided. While members not on the finance committee are welcome to attend and observe, please note that only committee members can actively participate in the discussion or vote on applicable agenda items. This is a great opportunity to learn more about our church's financials, upcoming projects, and how you can get more involved in supporting our mission.
