



### FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR BOB...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ...the next few Sunday's are very meaningful in the life of the church. They come and go every year and sometimes they pass us by without taking a moment to reflect on the importance of each of these three special Sundays.

Sunday, June 1st is Ascension Sunday. It marks the last time that Jesus visited with his disciples before returning home to the Father. Jesus tells his disciples in Luke 24:49,

"And now I will send the Holy Spirit, just as my Father promised. But stay here in the city until the Holy Spirit comes and fills you with the power from heaven." There are 30 scripture verses throughout the Bible when we hear, "Good things come to those who wait upon the Lord," Isaiah 40:31 and Lamentations 3:25-26 are two of those scriptures. Jesus was telling the disciples to stay here in the city because a good thing is coming to those who wait upon the Lord. It comes as promised on June 8th this year.

Sunday, June 8th is Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost is always celebrated on the fiftieth and final day of the Easter season. It was on this day the Holy Spirit comes to us as promised and the church is born. The Pentecost story can be found in Acts 2:1-21 if you want to read ahead on this most important day in the life of the church. 2 "Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. 4 And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability." The flame is an important symbol of our denomination as we use the Cross and Flame to tell the world we are United Methodists. The church was born on this day and one way we celebrate is by welcoming NEW members to the FUMC family. If you currently are not a member and would like to join our faith community it's not too late. Talk to me this Sunday and let me know if you want to join the family. Perhaps you have questions I need to answer for you to make that important decision for your life. It is our custom on Pentecost Sunday to wear something red to reflect the flame in the Pentecost story. I like to expand that to reflect all parts of the flame. When I look at a fire flame I see three primary colors. I see red, yellow and orange. So this year, I ask you to wear one of the three colors that symbolizes the Flame of Spirit.

**Sunday, June 15<sup>th</sup> is Trinity Sunday.** Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday following Pentecost every year. It is a day we reflect on the mystery of the Holy Trinity...God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. It is a mystery, but it is an exciting one for me as I see how THREE work together as ONE. We will also be celebrating Father's Day and Children's Sunday as well. It will be an action-packed day, and it just shows how busy the life of our church is today. Let's tell the story! It is a story of love...God's LOVE and our LOVE for each other! See you in church.





Our next rotation for providing meals for the families at Joshua House is August 14 - 16, 2025.

Did you know our church was one of the original 10 faith communities in this program, contributing our time, food, funds, and love to help hundreds of families over the past 22 years? Many of you remember when the families came to stay at the church, and we would turn our Sunday school rooms into bedrooms for the week. We got to work with some wonderful volunteers from Temple Israel during our shared hosting weeks over the many years. Together we fed the families, shared time with them and provided a listening ear when needed. Many of the children have gone on to graduate from college, serve in the military and give back to their communities in different ways. SFP is making a real difference!

Pati Frew-Waters started as Director of Seacoast Family Promise (SFP) in September 2006, when SFP was only 3 years old. She retired at the end of 2024. During Pati's 18+ years with SFP, she doubled the number of faith communities involved with the program. She also oversaw the day center's move into its permanent home in Exeter. In 2020, when Covid made it too dangerous for the families to be moving weekly, she arranged for the families to stay for several months at Christ Church before purchasing Joshua House from Bethany Church. This allowed the program to continue serving families without a pause. SFP has been working on expanding the Joshua House for the last couple of years, so we can serve more and larger families.

Many volunteers make this program work, but we could not have done it without Pati's amazing leadership for the past 18 years. The program has been so successful because of her initiative and enthusiasm. Let's honor her work! Donating toward the completion of the Joshua House expansion in her name would be a great way to honor Pati.

Joshua House is in Greenland and currently provides temporary housing for up to 4 families experiencing homelessness. We were expecting to receive an occupancy permit for the new section of the building this spring (which will house 4 more families), but that didn't happen because the current waterline access does not provide enough pressure to meet the minimum requirements of the new fire suppression system. This means that SFP will continue to operate at a reduced capacity until new pipes are installed and connected to the larger water line. This has increased the construction costs by \$35,000, bringing the total remaining construction costs to \$80,000.
