












#### LECTIONARY READINGS FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER:



FUMC's annual Pumpkin Patch is underway! We encourage everyone to volunteer their time to work a shift at the patch and, if you enjoy baking, to donate baked goods for sale at the patch table.

The Pumpkin Patch is our largest annual fundraiser, supporting some of our most important obligations, including payment of mission shares. I'd like to share some pumpkin details with you that you might now already know:

#### Q: What are mission shares?

Mission shares are the financial contributions that each local church makes to support the wider mission and ministry of the United Methodist Church. Think of it as shared giving: every congregation contributes, and together those gifts sustain ministries that no single church could accomplish alone. Mission shares are payable to the Annual Conference.

For 2025, our expected mission share contribution is about \$25,000.

## Q: Where does FUMC get all these pumpkins?

Our pumpkins are grown by Navajo farmers in New Mexico and delivered to New Hampshire by truck. The sales directly support the growers by creating jobs and helping preserve open farmland among the Navajo Nation. In fact, 60% of every pumpkin dollar goes right back to the growers.

That means we need approximately \$62,500 in gross pumpkin sales just to meet our mission share obligation.

# Q: Who at the church can I see about helping to pull off this outstanding initiative?

In addition to others, Sue Richards has given selflessly for many years to ensure the success of the pumpkin patch. She can help guide you as to the best ways for you to volunteer your time or resources. She can also help you sign up to work a shift or two at the pumpkin booth. No experience needed! We make a commitment to the grower to be open for regular business hours and there are LOTS of shifts to cover.

# Q: Is that a lot of pumpkins?

Yes... yes, it is.



But with everyone's help...volunteering, baking, and spreading the word... it's possible! Thank you for supporting the Pumpkin Patch and helping FUMC continue its mission both here at home and around the world.

As said in Matthew 9:37 (NIV) "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." Don't let our our annual pumpkin patch be a reminder of this truth. Every volunteer who gives of themselves in time, donations of baked goods, or pumpkin purchases is answering this call. We can turn pumpkins into mission support, fellowship and abundant blessings for our community.



# Seacoast Family Promise - Volunteers needed

As one of the founding churches for Seacoast Family Promise, First UMC has been assisting families experiencing homelessness for 20+ years now. The families used to come to our church to stay, but since COVID hit in 2020, they have been staying at the Joshua House in Greenland. However, the network of churches involved in this ministry still provide dinners for the families every day. First UMC, along with our partner in this work, Temple Israel, are responsible for providing dinner 5 - 6 weeks per year. Below are the remaining dates for 2025 that FUMC is responsible for providing dinner:

October 9, 10, 11

November 13, 14, 15

December 21, 26, 27 (21st is a Sunday - Temple traded days with us so they will provide dinner on Christmas Day.)

Volunteers cook the meal and deliver it to the Joshua House in Greenland ready-to-serve.

Updates to previous articles:

Joshua House – the new addition to the building is complete except for the kitchen stove and we have 4 families currently staying there (13 people). Renovations on the original house are in progress, and we hope to have them completed by the end of the year. I did a tour of the building a month ago and it is really impressive. This program has come a long way since its beginning.

Donations for Joshua House in honor of Pati Frew-Waters - donations so far to honor Pati total \$15,982.50!

This ministry has been an important one for this church since 2003 and I hope people will volunteer so we can continue to be a part of such important outreach. This program changes lives forever. 



# The Dash




