

Why does it mean so much to me?

When I was in my late teens, my parents bought a three family of beachfront property up in Maine with another couple. The other couple was very religious and in their unit, they had the poem "Footprints in the Sand" framed and attached to one of the posts. Over the 15 or so years that they owned it, I probably read it 100 times. It intrigued me. I didn't grow up in an overtly religious family. We went to church on Sundays and we'd help out with different church events when it was called for, but we didn't decorate our home with religious icons for the most part. I found myself reading the poem and it made me become quite emotional. It pointed out that when we need the Lord most...when we feel abandoned and alone, He is there to support us.

How has it impacted my life?

I find myself going back to that poem again and again as a reminder of God's never-ending love for us. I take a lot of solace in the fact that even when I am struggling, that our God is nearby to help me through it. Even today, my eyes well up when I read it knowing that someone as powerful as God, who has much more on His plate than my problems is ever-present in all of our lives. Last Sunday, I'd walked to church. Between the time that I'd come to church and the time that I walked home, it'd snowed. As there hadn't been anyone walking on the sidewalk that I was, I couldn't help but smile at the singular set of footprints that I'd made in the freshly fallen snow.

What do I want others to take away from it?

You're never alone. No matter the size of the issues that have you on your plate, our God is there to help.

I may only be one person, but I can be one person that makes a difference.

SEACOAST FAMILY PROMISE
