


I lift up my eyes to the mountains – where does my help come from?

I lift up my eyes to the hills—from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.

Dear Friends,

If you have ever been to lowa, especially northern lowa, where I grew up, you may have discovered that the land is very flat and without many trees. Like a desert oasis dotted along the wilderness sands, trees can be found in little bunches wherever there are farmhouses or towns. The same holds true for bodies of water. Even though we have some lakes and streams, our biggest bodies of water border the state on each side: the Missouri River to the West and the Mississippi River to the East.

When I made my first trip to the East coast, I was fully enamored with the ocean and mountains, and I decided that this is where I wanted to live. I moved out here in 1972 and never looked back except, of course, to return to lowa to visit my family regularly.

Maybe my love of the ocean and mountains is one of the reasons I like Psalm 121 so much. Of course, the message is far more than just "lifting my eyes to the hills" because the rest of the Psalm goes on to express the Psalmist's joy in God's presence with us. God's help is always there for us, and God doesn't go to sleep on the job.

Verse 7 declares that "The Lord will keep you from all evil," which can be confusing in light of all the evil we encounter in our world. But when we read the second half of the verse, we find that it says, "God will keep your life." Evils DO attack us, but when we have the presence of God in our lives and trust that God is with us in all things, we have assurance that God has our souls. Whatever befalls us, God holds us close to God's heart. We are God's beloved children.

Moving away from my family has been challenging and has brought some issues with it, but between the ocean and mountains, as well as finding friends and family out here, I am reminded that God continues to bless me. I am reminded that God "has my back" as well as "the backs" of those whom I love way out in lowa.

Thank you for being part of my life as my church family. May God continue to guide and bless us all.

- Sharp rise in utility costs of 43% in 2018 over 2017 to total of \$26,808
- Congregational concern for financial transparency and additional financial information

  - Monthly committee meeting minutes posted in Sanborn Hall
  - Monthly financial reports available for review & copy in church office
  - Quarterly state-of-the-church financial reports published in Beacon


