


ODE TO FEBRUARY

"The sun was shining by the sea shining with all his might... And this was odd because it was the middle of the night."

(The Walrus and the Carpenter from "Through the Looking Glass" by Lewis Carroll") "Through the Looking Glass," penned in 1872 by Charles Lutwidge Dodgson under the nom de plume of "Lewis Carroll", while nonsensical on the surface, is well known to conceal a plethora of sarcastic political commentary. So extensive are Carroll's social and political references, that in 1960 Martin Garder produced a complete volume explicating the symbolism in this and the companion Alice's Adventures in Wonderland under the title "The Annotated Alice." In the saga of "The Walrus and the Carpenter," Carroll targets shady political fat-cats growing flush through corruption and the duping of a naïve electorate. Symbolically, in the opening quatrain, the illuminating property of the Sun, shining its light in dark places, directs us to peer into the shadows for that which is hidden from view. In his bid to raise consciousness, the chiaroscuro play on light and shadow, in metaphor and parable, dominates much of Carroll's work. We are now in the dark, the nighttime part of the year, awaiting the return of the life-giving power of the sun. Winter is traditionally a time for turning inward. Perhaps activating our inner searchlight will yield clues to the deeper rhythms of life.

THE REVERSE LENT CHALLENGE DON'T GIVE SOMETHING UP. TAKE SOMETHING ON!




This year for Lent, don't give something up. Take something on.


The Heifer International Easter theme is "HATCH HOPE THIS EASTER"

Portsmouth First United Methodist Church 2017 Finance Committee Report January 16, 2018

As promised during the recent all-church Visioning meeting in early December, this Finance Committee report presents an overview of PFUMC financial performance for year 2017. The church has been truly blessed through the generosity of its members and friends and by the success and fellowship experienced during its end-of-year fundraising activities. Some noteworthy accomplishments for this year include:

- Payment in full of our United Methodist Conference Mission Shares; this is just a huge accomplishment for the church as it represents the third
 year in a row we have been able to provide full funding for the ministry of the United Methodist Conference throughout New England and the
 world.
- Your Capital Campaign contributions have also allowed us to completely pay off both of the loans which were required for the construction of our new kitchen. Being debt- free will allow us to do some exciting things in the coming years.
- We have also continued to reach out into both the Portsmouth and general religious community through silent offering contributions to Habitat for Humanity and the Fuller House; special contributions to Seacoast Family Promise; support of Hurricane Relief through UMCOR and through our Christmas project donations to the Heifer Project along with sending our Christmas offering proceeds to the Methodist Higher Education Scholarship Fund, which provides welcome support for many Methodist college students including our own church kids. None of these great projects would have been possible without the love and caring of each one of you.

A couple of important 2018 Finance Committee updates are also worth noting:

- Due to the high level of activity during the last quarter of 2017 the Church Council made the decision to delay our annual Stewardship Campaign until April 2018. We respectfully ask that you continue to contribute at your current pledge rate in the meantime.
- In conjunction with the church Visioning Program, we will be conducting our Gratitude Campaign during the last three Sundays of April, culminating with a special Gratitude Campaign celebration on May 6. Long-time PFUMC friend and United Methodist Foundation Director of Stewardship David Abbott will be preaching on that special day.

We pray that each of you will continue to support this church as only Portsmouth members and friends can, and that 2018 will be a blessed year for our entire church family.
