## WHAT'S SALE ON YOUR JOURNEY OF FAITH



Dear Friends,

"... When [the wise men] saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Matthew 2:10-11 (NRSV)

So, have you recovered from the holidays? How was 2019 for you? Have you made your list of resolutions for 2020? What goals are you setting for this coming year?

The Wise Men/Magi, generally considered scholars or astronomers from the east (such as Persia) had a goal. They had studied the skies and stars, discovering an unusual star so they decided to follow it. This would have been along and sometimes perilous journey for them. More than likely, they were traveling for a long, long time. Scholars estimate that Jesus would have been a toddler when the Wise Men arrived in Jerusalem, and note that, in the passage above, they entered the "house," which would indicate that Mary and Joseph were no longer in a stable, but in a home.

Theirs was a long journey into the unknown: not knowing where they would eventually end up, maybe not even knowing IF they would find where this star would lead them, or what they would find. But they arrived and were overwhelmed with joy to find Jesus and his mother Mary, believing he was the king of the Jews. That is quite a statement coming from three Gentiles who worship other gods. Yet, they reached their goal with great joy and offered their gifts.

Isn't all of life a journey into the unknown? I mean, if we really think about it, we never really know what is around the corner. What can we learn from the Wise Men? I think several things. First, they studied and carefully learned about the star. In their research and studying, they discovered the possibility of the birth of a new king, one that was so important it prompted them to make the trip to find him. Whenever we make decisions, we can spend time pondering them and researching as needed or at least weighing the pros and cons before we set out in a different direction.

And, we can learn about perseverance and gratitude from these men who appeared seemingly out of nowhere to worship the king. Their appearance in the story of Jesus' birth is a message that Jesus came for all people, including Gentiles, including those who are poor, those who are wealthy, as well as people from all over. Jesus is the Savior of the *world*, and the Wise Men represent those who saw him in his real identity and celebrated his arrival.

Maybe this year, our goals can include finding ways to grow even more on our faith journeys. We can have resolutions that not only improve ourselves, but improve the world as we follow Christ and live for him throughout the year. Maybe those resolutions are some we can keep with joy! 


### **Blessings Bank -**

The Finance/Trustees are studying a book by Henri Nouwen, **Spirituality of Giving**, each month, we will be sharing little "snippets" from what we are learning.

From *Bread for the Journey* by Nouwen: "Community is first of all a quality of the heart. It grows from the spiritual knowledge that we are alive not for ourselves but for one another."

We are a community of faith, and we need each other in order to be in fruitful ministry for Christ in our community and world. Sometimes we might think that giving of our time, talent and treasure is an obligation, but it's important to think about how we support this community of faith in our stewardship of giving not only financially, but also with our time, our prayers, and our service.

Nouwen says in our study book (p. 50), "We have something to offer—friendship, prayer, peace, love, fidelity, affection, ministry with those in need—and these things are so valuable that people are willing to make their resources available to sustain them."

What we have is actually a call to community, to being who God has called us to be, to be steeped in our faith journey and commitment to the mission and ministry of our church. Stewardship is a spiritual journey, as Nouwen writes in *Here and Now*: "A truly spiritual life is life in which we won't rest until we have found rest in the embrace of the One who is the Father and Mother of all desires."

May we strive for spiritual growth, working together in unity as we seek to be faithful followers of Jesus in building the Kingdom of God here on earth.



# Community OUTREACH

Backpack Ministry/End 68 Hours of Hunger Update - This program continues to thrive and, though it's hard for me to believe, we have now started our 10<sup>th</sup> school year. We are currently serving 96 children total from all 6 Portsmouth schools and Birch Tree Center (school for Autistic children in Newington). We have been very fortunate with fund-raising this summer – Pease Tenant Assoc., Liberty Mutual/ Protective Insurance and Proulx Real Estate all did big fundraisers for us and we added over \$16,000 to our funds. Seacoast Family Promise – SFP is going strong. Our next rotation is March 1 - March 8 and we currently have (4) families in the program – a total of 14 people. All of the families we worked with in 2018 and 2019 to date have moved to stable housing and have remained there. We have had 9 cars donated this year for our current and former families. This is such a blessing, since without reliable transportation, these families cannot succeed. If you know of anyone who might have a vehicle available to donate (it is a tax deductible donation), please let them know we always have a need for them and they will change a family's life forever by doing so.

If you would like to volunteer, we have opportunities available to help with prepping the Sunday school rooms for family arrival, cleaning them up when it's over the next week, dinner crew for Friday night and we could always use new overnight volunteers. Many of the current volunteers in this program have been doing it all 15 years, so some fresh volunteers would be appreciated. There is a training session for new volunteers at Bethany Church in Greenland on Sunday Nov 3rd if you think you might be interested. I will be attending. We also need cash donations to purchase breakfast and lunch food items when the families are here.

This program definitely changes lives and I am proud that our church is a part of it, along with 20+ other congregations in the Seacoast NH area.
