

I can say with confidence that we accomplished the first goal and the tabulation of the pledge results, currently in progress, will determine how we did against the second goal. The committee had the foresight to invite David Abbott down to Portsmouth to help us in our initial planning meeting last October. Many of you met David, Director of Stewardship, United Methodist Foundation of New England, when he preached on Gratitude Sunday on May 6. One of David's suggestions was for us to consider using the Gratitude Path, written by Kent Millard, as a resource in our planning for the campaign. We did exactly that and appreciated the book's message so much that we patterned the majority of the campaign after the book. The framework, scheduling, the congregational letters from members and the Gratitude Moments were all things taken from the book. 



FUMC Portsmouth a Reconciling Congregation


