

Dear Friends,

This teaching from Ephesians is a challenge for most of us. I often hear someone say, "I never heard him/her speak unkindly of another person." That is the way we are taught, and yet, we know that isn't the prevailing way things are done in our society. The letter to the church at Ephesus was intended to help and remind them of the teachings of Jesus. Apparently, they were struggling to work together as a congregation.

When I was growing up, my mother often said the familiar rhyme, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." I know she said it to try to help us not be so sensitive to something others say to us, but no matter how often she repeated it, I never found that I wasn't hurt by someone else's words. I also know that, as hard as I try, my words have hurt other people.

As we move into Lent, I would like to invite all of us to stop and think about how we live our lives as Christians in the world. Do our words and actions reflect the Savior we follow? Have we invited God to, as the Psalmist prayed, "Set a guard over my mouth, O Lord; keep watch over the door of my lips." (Psalm 141:3)

If it has been our practice to give something up for Lent, maybe this year, we can give up or begin working at being aware of how we use words and actions to present Christ to the world as his followers. I highly recommend reading a book called "The Practice or the Presence of God" by Brother Lawrence which can be found on Amazon, through Barnes and Noble, or other book distributors. It provides much food for thought about living in God's ways.

Most of us try to live in God's ways, but it seems like Lent might offer an opportunity to revisit some of the teachings and scriptures that remind us about what that means in our own lives. Maybe we will become very practiced at "giving grace to those who hear," as the end of our verse above says. We begin the journey of Lent!


INVITATION TO MEMBERSHIP

THE BOSTON POST CANE TRADITION IS PRESENTED TO BARBARA MILLAR

A tradition of celebrating the oldest citizen in NE towns was started by the late Mr. Edwin A. Grozier, Publisher of the Boston Post on

August 2, 1909. And on February 28th, 2019 was presented to our very own Barbara Millar.

The canes were all made by J.F. Fradley and Co., a New York manufacturer, from ebony with a 2 inch 14-carat gold head decorated by hand, and a ferruled tip. The head was engraved with the inscription, presented by the Boston Post to the oldest citizen of Kittery and handed down by the Board of Selectmen.

SEACOAST FAMILY PROMISE

SFP is going stronger than ever. Our next rotation is January 20-27 and we currently have (3) families in the program – 3 single moms and a total of 10 children (8 under the age of 6). All of the families we worked with in 2018 (except for these 3 which are currently in the program) transitioned to stable housing and have remained there. The Day Center in Exeter is currently undergoing significant improvements due to the generosity of the community and Riverwoods, who made us their charity this year and raised thousands of dollars for the program. If you would like to volunteer, we have opportunities available to help with prepping the Sunday school rooms for family arrival, cleaning them up when it's over the next week, dinner crew for Friday night and we could always use new overnight volunteers. Many of the current volunteers in this program have been doing it all 13 years, so some fresh volunteers would be appreciated. This program definitely changes lives and I am proud that our church is a part of it, along with 20+ other congregations in the Seacoast NH area.
