




Every Sunday we enjoy having fresh flowers on the altar given in memory, honor or celebration of someone special to you or the church family.

First United Methodist Church of Portsmouth Trustees & Finance Committee Update

During the ongoing repair of the sanctuary slate roof, the contractor observed age and extensive damage of the asphalt shingles covering Sanborn Hall. To insure we stay on top of the situation and avoid potential leakage through this roof, Church Council, at the recommendation of Trustees voted to authorize up to a \$30,000 for the replacement of the Sanborn Hall shingles, which will be funded through our Piscataqua Bank Line of Credit. (If enough money is donated toward this project, we won't need to borrow any.) Having this work completed in the next few months will avoid any possible leakage similar to what we have experienced in the Sanctuary over the past several months. We will keep you informed on our progress with this project.

While we have your attention and to promote financial transparency within the congregation, we would like to provide an update on both Capital Campaign and the church loan activity.

The following is a summary of the campaign that was kicked off two years ago:

- Total campaign pledges \$156,766
- Funds received to date \$134,787
- Current Capital Campaign fund balance \$839
- Capital expenditures paid to date:
 - o Kitchen upgrade \$72,772
 - Alarm system \$42,570
 - Roof repairs \$21,606
 - Total expenditures = \$133,948
- United Methodist Foundation Loan \$35,000*
- Piscataqua Line of Credit Advance \$40,000*
- *Both loans paid in full during 2017
- Projects currently under contract:
 - Slate roof repair \$24,000 (Church Council approved funding for 50% from the Piscataqua Line of Credit)
 - o Masonry repair \$6,000
- Other projects under consideration:
 - Boiler repair or replacement
 - Vestry carpet
 - o Randall Room flooring






