Pumpkin arrival has been delayed due to FEMA restrictions on drivers and will arrive on 10/3, at 9:00 am.

It will look and run quite differently with a COVID-19 safety plan created by Sue Sarosiek and I and approved by the Portsmouth Health Dept.

Here is the proposed plan:

- -Everyone will wear a mask/cloth face covering, use hand sanitizer at the entrance station and maintain social distancing in the Patch.
- -The new pallet lay-out will make social distancing easier.
- -The check-out waiting line will have orange lines that are 6-ft. apart.
- -The check-out booth will be in a new position where a cashier will handle payments inside the booth and 1-2 people measuring pumpkins will be outside the booth.
- -Weekends and Columbus Day, check-out will be at both windows.
- -Pie Baking will still happen in our kitchen on Tuesdays and Fridays from 8:30 a.m. until about 2 p.m. Pies will be cooled, put into labeled baggies and kept on the counter for customers to pick up.

Clean-up will be on Sunday, 11/1 from 9 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

















































COMMUNITY OUTREACH UPDATES
