Second, are you willing to learn from being on this committee? Third, how will you share your learnings and your gifts with the congregation?

We have a Nurture Committee, but we have not been able to find someone to lead that group. It is my observation that many people are nurturing others regularly through visits, cards, phone calls, meals, support, and prayer. Even though we have folks serving on the committee, it still takes an entire church family to nurture others. We all should be part of nurture! Having said that, if someone would like to be a "go-to" person for what needs to be done, who needs to be seen or supported, I would love to hear from you! (We can talk about what that would look like!)

As the scripture passage above reminds us, when one person is hurting, we all are affected, and when someone finds care and healing, we all can enter into the "exuberance!" Thank you for being who you are! Thank you for sharing your gifts! God bless!



Congratulations and thank you to all who donated.


POWER OF PRAYER

The Finance/Trustees are studying a book by Henri Nouwen, **Spirituality of Giving**, each month, we will be sharing little "snippets" from what we are learning.


Spirituality of Giving


