How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity! It is like precious oil poured on the head, running down on the beard, running down on Aaron's beard, down on the collar of his robe. Psalm 133:1-2 (NIV)

Our country is deeply fractured. Division has reached the point that we view those who differ from us not as compatriots but as people who live in a different country, a country we would not want to live in. In protests and counter-protests, on social media and our choice of news, our fractures entrench themselves. Even basic publichealth guidance has become a flashpoint. We have moved beyond the point where a return to "normal" can be achieved by symbolic gestures or speeches or prayer-vigils. The divisions among us can only be resolved by real, substantive change.

And thank God. When tens of millions are unemployed and yet the stock market soars, things must change. When policing methods continue to brutalize Black and Brown people, things must change. When more than a hundred and fifty thousand people die from a preventable illness, things must change.

And your church can be part of changing things for the better. Your church can help heal the divisions in your community by addressing your community's pain. Your church's works of justice and mercy have never been more important. Can you imagine what beautiful, healing work hundreds of thousands of faithful Christians might accomplish? Systems of oppression named and dismantled. Educational disparities acknowledged and addressed. Hunger revealed and alleviated. It would be like precious oil poured on the head, running down on the beard, running down on Aaron's beard, down on the collar of his robe.

Pumpkin Patch

Where has the summer gone? It's hard to believe that our lawn will be orange again soon! A lot of creative planning has occurred in order to follow the current safety protocol: masks will be required (a new City of Portsmouth rule), sanitation stations will be at 2 marked entrances, pumpkin layout and the Booth location will be adjusted to allow for social distancing, hard surfaces will be sanitized often, "sneeze shields" will be installed at the Booth windows, there will be a maximum capacity of shoppers, etc. Truck unloading will be different. The Portsmouth Health Dept. has been contacted to make sure we have the safest Patch possible. Since congregants in a high-risk category may not feel comfortable helping to unload and/or staff the Booth, social media will be used to help promote these unique and fun volunteer opportunities.

Over our last 15 years, we have developed a growing number of loyal customers who only buy from us. Given our current situation, people need the joy and fun that our Patch provides even more.
